

Director Certification Program 2025

(A four-phase program with Phases 3 & 4 offered in 2025)

DCP is a four-phase program with two phases offered each year. It is conducted annually to help new directors deal with the challenges they face as decision makers. The program is designed to accelerate the process by which directors become active, effective board members. For the new director, training is very important to establish an understanding of the responsibilities of the position.

Through DCP, directors will gain the skills necessary to become a contributing member of the board and fulfill their duty to access the information needed to make sound business decisions.

Upon completion of all four phases, achievement will be recorded by the Council and acknowledged with a certificate from CoBank and the Council.

EVENING SPEAKER



The evening speaker will be Husker Football great Adam Carriker. Carriker was born in Hastings, NE before moving halfway across the country. He still aspired to be a blackshirt, and he fulfilled his dream. In his career, he was twice named first-team All-Big 12, leading the conference in sacks and winning the Big 12 Defensive Lineman of the Year award his senior season, along with several other awards including finishing with All-America honors, in addition to being named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll three times.

He's also been named to Nebraska's All-Century Team and has been inducted into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame.

Carriker played 8 years in the NFL, winning Rookie of the Year with the Rams, before going on to great success in the business world. His current show, the Carriker Chronicles, aka the People's Show, has been viewed by millions. Carriker is married to his college sweetheart and they have 6 children.
